We Believe in:-

SOCIAL JUSTICE: This reflects God's divine character because God is just. Social Justice in action is treating people with equal regard, and consequently also having a special concern for the needs of the poor, the suffering, and the powerless.

RESPECT FOR LIFE: Humans beings are created in God's likeness. It is therefore right to respect every human life from conception to natural death. We therefore especially affirm the fundamental dignity of those what are unborn, infirm, mentally or physically disabled, elderly, or unable to speak for themselves.

RECONCILIATION: God's kingdom is heralded by a community in which all are called to be reconciled in Christ Jesus. This should be reflected beyond the church, in the breaking down of barriers that divide our local communities and society generally. It is a task for all who are engaged in politics, at local, national, and international levels, to work towards reconciliation and healing.

ACTIVE COMPASSION: God is just and loving, and human beings are called to active loving service to others. Such compassionate love inspires an attitude not only of detached justice, but also of open-hearted generosity. The government should motivate individuals, families, charities, and other associations, to active compassion to meet the fundamental needs of the poor before satisfying the preferences of the rich.

EMPOWERMENT: All authority is from God, and must be exercised responsibly. Whether authority is represented by structures of the state, the church, or the family, each should be directed towards serving and benefiting those under it for the common good, and social and economic betterment of everyone.

WISE STEWARDSHIP: Human beings are called to be stewards of God's creation, including economic activity. Economic resources are given by God and may serve people's needs and mutual care and concern for others. The primary task of government in relation to the economy, is to oversee the establishment of just structures in both the commercial and public sector that are fair, and with community needs in mind. Such justice includes maintaining a sound currency against inflation, and encouraging wealth creation by gainful employment.
